The chapel is accessible at all times. The combination is 415. The door will lock safely behind you.



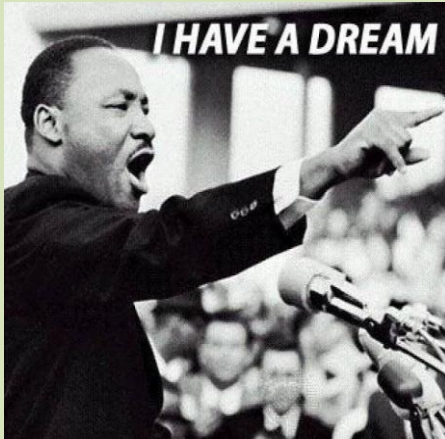
**REMEMBERING
DR. MARTIN
LUTHER KING**

According to media reports, “racial tensions” have been running high. Well, I remember a time when such tensions were so high that people of good will of every race and creed joined hands together in support of the work being done by Dr. Martin Luther King. It was 1963 and Dr. King was coming to Boston for a peaceful demonstration and march for racial equality and justice. My dad who was a police officer in the inner city gave me strict orders to have no part of this when I told him I was thinking of participating. “They’re just a bunch of troublemakers”, he insisted. I was over 21 and asserted my first amendment right to assemble peacefully for the purpose of redressing grievances. Dad said that was a bunch of nonsense. Choosing to disregard his advice, I showed up the next day at a park which was being used as a gathering point. Who did I run into but my uncle who was a police captain in that area. So much for keeping my involvement a secret. Worse, a photographer snapped a picture of me with some other demonstrators and it was published on the front page of the Boston Globe the next day. My father placed a copy of the paper where I would be sure to notice it. He was not happy, but let it go.

The Civil Rights Movement, as it was called, changed the face of America. Although Lincoln had freed the slaves at an incredible cost in lives a hundred years earlier, racial discrimination of various kinds was rampant throughout the country. Everything from discrimination in housing and employment to refusing service in restaurants and other public accommodations to denying people the right to vote. People were treated rudely and inhumanely because of the color of their skin. Dr. King, a Baptist preacher from Atlanta, and all who were associated with him engaged in non-violent peaceful demonstrations which subjected them to everything from public ridicule to being knocked down with water hoses and being jailed. If you are interested in getting the flavor of what that was like, go see the move “Selma” which opened this weekend.

A great deal has changed since the 60’s. African Americans can be seen in every walk of life and can live or work wherever they choose. But there is more work to be done.

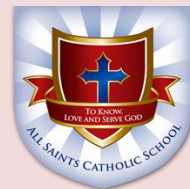

BUILDING & MAINTENANCE FUND

Did you know that our parish facilities are valued at more than \$10 million dollars? Maintaining them is an expensive endeavor requiring sacrifices on the part of all good stewards. Last year alone, we expended nearly \$50K to replace the church roof.

This year we will be undertaking the refurbishment of our sanctuary beginning with the replacement of the pews, kneelers, and carpeting at a cost of at least \$150K. A proposal is under consideration to install new marble tile in the sanctuary, Blessed Sacrament Chapel, and Baptistry. All of these things are more than possible when every conscientious household is contributing according to the principles of good stewardship. Our motivation for contributions should always be rooted in our own need to give proportionately from all that we have been given.
