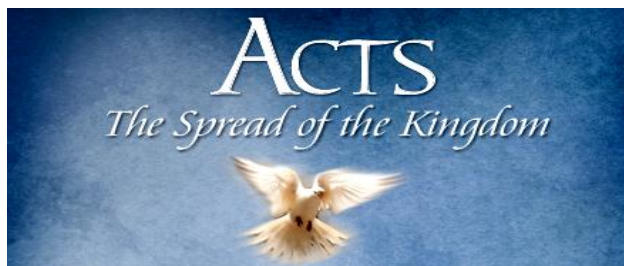
*Behold
The Lamb
Of God!*

With today's passage from the gospel of John, we are reminded of the origin of the words we hear right before Communion at every Mass. John the Baptizer said this when Jesus was walking nearby and two of his own disciples took off after him. One of them, of course, was our own patron Andrew who, after spending an afternoon with Jesus ran home and told his older brother, Simon, "*We have found the Messiah!*"

This passage has a great deal to teach us about the very nature of faith. For many people *faith* can be very loosely defined. While the faith of Andrew and Simon Peter was partially influenced by the testimony of John, it resulted mostly from the time they were able to spend with Jesus at the place where he was staying. It is a plain fact that people became disciples of Jesus after meeting up with him in a very personal way. Many of them were the beneficiaries of his healing power. Others were inspired by his humility and preaching. Others were present when Jesus performed mighty deeds.

Pope Francis in his stirring exhortation "*The Joy of the Gospel*" and in his daily homilies keeps calling church members to seek a faith that really works through an encounter with the Jesus of the gospels. This can involve laying aside pre-conceived notions of faith that we learned as children so that the words of Jesus can penetrate more deeply into our minds and hearts. The effect of this kind of faith is a transformation---either little by little or even dramatically---of our thoughts and actions. This kind of faith affects the way men and women think of themselves, sometimes liberating them from forms of bondage to long term, destructive habits. A personal faith in Jesus can also make all the difference in the world when it comes to marriage and family life. Husbands and fathers become spiritual leaders who are present to their wives and children, rather than just chained to their jobs or careers. Wives and mothers can manage their homes and command the respect of their children. Single people can reject the lie that success lies in years of schooling and often pointless dating.

And children who love to place their faith in fables and fantasies can come to know Jesus as a friend who will never fail them.

JOURNEY OF FAITH

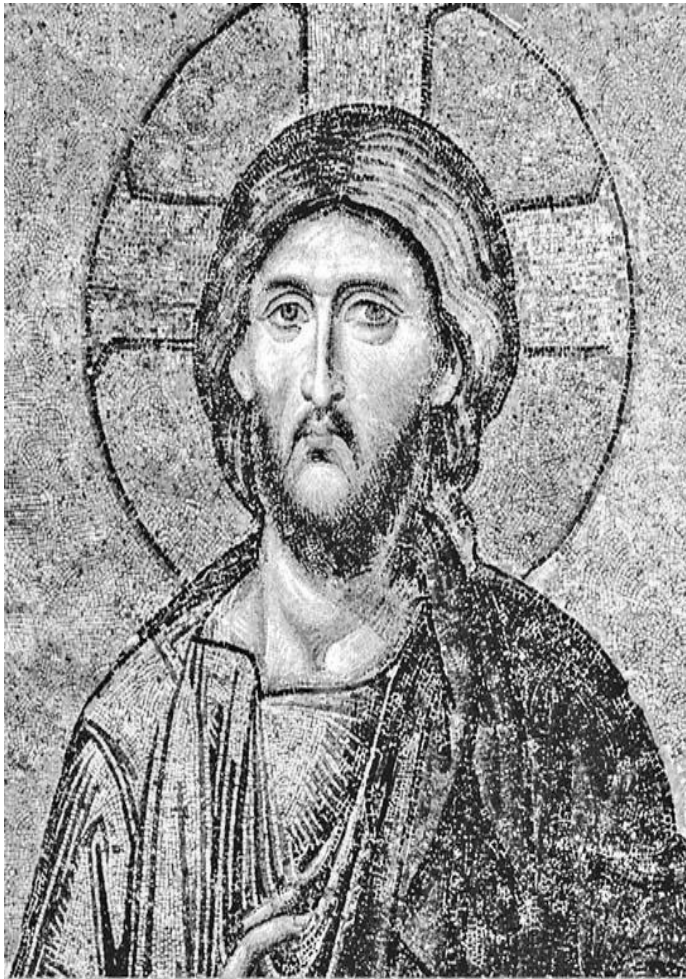
