**MASSES MOVE
TO JOYCE CENTER
NEXT WEEK**

Following the last Mass this weekend, a crew will come in to prepare the pews for removal from the church beginning on Monday or Tuesday (weather permitting). **Any parishioner who would like to have a pew may do so just by hauling it off the parking lot on Monday or Tuesday.** We also have a small church which has expressed an interest in the pews.

The carpeting contractor will be coming in right behind the pew removers to take up the old carpeting and begin laying the new carpet. These tasks will take over a week's time. **The new pews will be delivered and installed beginning on March 16th and that will take around eight days.**

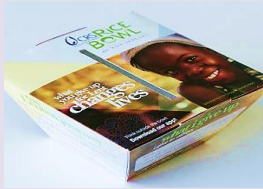
We will conduct all weekend Masses in the Joyce Center on March 8th, 15th, and 22nd. Interestingly, what is now the Joyce Center was once called the Parish Activities Center (The PAC) and all Services were conducted there from 1965 until the church was dedicated on Nov. 30, 1979. For our older parishioners this will be like "old home week". For all of us it will pose special challenges.

We will have about 400 chairs as opposed to the church which seats more than 600 in pews. I want to ask our 9 O'Clock Massgoers who are able to do so if they would consider shifting to the 5pm Saturday or to the 11:45 Sunday on one or more of the three Sundays we will be out of the church. Since the chairs are not fixed to the floor, there will be a tendency for them to be moved around. I would just ask that at the conclusion of Mass if everyone would straighten things up so as to be ready for the Mass that follows.

To simplify the giving of Holy Communion in an unfamiliar setup, we will probably distribute it only under the form of the Bread of Life. We will, of course, return to our customary practice when we move back to the church on Palm Sunday. The hymnals will be on tables in the corridor

**PREPARING FOR BAPTISM CLASS
SUNDAY, March 8th
1PM IN ROOM 4**

This is a one session class that is **required** of all parents who are baptizing a child for the first time. First time godparents are also welcome, but participation is optional. Following this class, parents must contact Father Jack to see if there may be any special circumstances in scheduling the actual baptism. **We celebrate baptisms as requested one month in advance**, but we do not celebrate baptisms during Lent. Here's a little preview of some of the things that are covered during the class:

- Church law requires only one baptismal sponsor: A practicing, confirmed Catholic who is 18 years of age or over.
- If there are two sponsors, **both** must be confirmed, practicing Catholics.
- If the parents are not yet married by the church, or if there should be just one parent, please contact the pastor at least a month in advance.
- At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic in order to baptize and raise a child according to the faith of the Church.
