**Gifted
And
Talented**

Much has been written in this column (either by me or Pope Francis) about how important it is that we acknowledge the difference between being a *church member* and an *intentional disciple* of Jesus Christ. Some percentage of church members are, in fact, seeking the way of intentional discipleship, but it is probably under 20%. One important distinction between these two ways of belonging to the church is that intentional disciples become aware that they have been given gifts and talents whose specific purpose is for helping *build up* the church. These kinds of gifts and talents go beyond the more common practice by which people volunteer to help out at the church. It is true that there are many church activities that cannot be conducted without the help of volunteers. But the **principal tasks** of the church are those related to its reason for being: **To announce the Good News to the poor, the infirm, the hungry, the thirsty, the homeless, and to all who are in the grips of some kind of bondage.**

With the Feast of Pentecost coming up next Sunday, it would be helpful for all of us to ask the Holy Spirit for the ability to discern what specific *gifts & talents* we may already have but are underutilizing or for ones that we may be open to receiving. Here's a familiar prayer we can sing or say that may help:

**Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on me
Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on me
Melt me, mold me, fill me, use me
Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on me**

Consider this teaching of St. Paul in the 12th chapter of his first letter to the Corinthians: *Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. And God has placed in the church first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, of guidance, and of different kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? Now eagerly desire the greater gifts.* This is only a partial list of spiritual gifts, but notice it includes *helpers* and *those who can give guidance*. Pray earnestly about naming and claiming your spiritual gifts and talents.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

On the 5th Sunday of Easter, we conducted an extraordinary second collection for the relief of earthquake victims in Nepal. You contributed nearly \$5K to which the parish added another 5K from our tithing commitment to the poor & needy!

Our YTD income is down by 7.6% vs. a year ago. Most of this is due to a \$62K decrease in gifts to the Building & Maintenance Fund. Jesus said, *"The measure by which we give is the measure by which we will receive."* What is your measure? Is it five pennies on every dollar? More? Less?
