**HOW GOES  
OUR PRACTICE  
OF STEWARDSHIP**

Did you know that as recently as forty years ago, most Catholics had either never heard of *stewardship* or thought of it as *something Protestants do*? Around 1975 intense efforts were begun in many parishes to educate Catholics as to the meaning and importance of stewardship as a *way of life*. Initially, many thought that stewardship referred exclusively to how we should be more generous in our financial support of the church sort of like a synonym for tithing. Soon Catholics began to understand that *stewardship* is a major theme in the teaching of Jesus because it is all about the way in which his followers are called to manage their time, talent, and treasure. This notion is in marked contrast to the much more widely held belief that *my time is my time, my talents are my talents, and my treasure is my treasure*. Becoming good stewards has proved a challenge for many down to the present day.

At St. Andrew's we conduct three distinct stewardship "*campaigns*" each focusing on one particular aspect. On the First Sunday of Advent we invite those seeking to be faithful disciples to renew their commitment to *Sacrificial Giving*. That was just two months ago. How goes your management of all the resources God has entrusted to your care? **Would you be surprised to learn that gifts earmarked for charitable works (including the Food Pantry and Street People have decreased by 50%?**

On Pentecost Sunday each year we ask everyone to indicate how they will place at least some of their talents and abilities in the service of the parish and the greater community. **How goes your offer of service?**

On Ash Wednesday we ask parishioners interested in *repenting and believing the Good News* to set aside a portion of time for the purpose of spiritual growth and development. That's coming up quickly on Feb. 18<sup>th</sup>. **Will you be ready to be generous in the use of your time for this purpose?** Or, will you be so busy about many other important matters that spiritual growth will have to wait for another day?

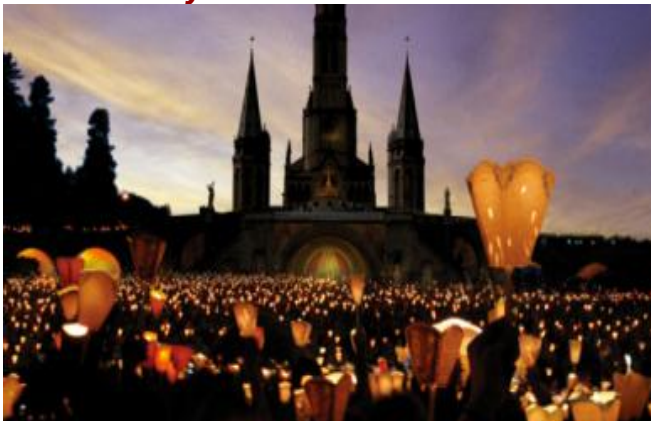
Did you know that **one in ten Americans** is a former Catholic? An estimated **42% of Catholics** leave the Church at some point in their lives. **50% of the latter are young people under the age of 25!** The reasons are many and varied, but a principal one is that they did not experience what Pope Francis calls ***The Joy of the Gospel*** in the Catholic Church. Stopping or reversing this trend calls for a new enthusiasm and more effective ways of sharing our personal faith in Jesus Christ. **But we cannot give what we do not have.** Before we invite others, we must first become disciples. ***Disciples are people who have fallen in love with the Lord Jesus Christ.***

Father Jack will be convening a meeting of parish leaders on Feb. 21<sup>st</sup> to explore how each of us can become more *intentional disciples*. Our good shepherds, Pope Francis and Archbishop Coakley, are inviting and challenging all Catholics to consider more seriously what it means for us to be sinners who can become holy.

The Adult Formation Committee met last Sunday to consider our ***Growing the Faith*** offerings for Lent/Easter. After a presentation by Fr. Jack and considerable discussion, a decision was made to have one principal offering. It will be the five session video based presentation featuring Fr. Robert Barron's ***"The New Evangelization"***. Our hope is that many people will participate in either Sunday or weekday sessions so that we can become better prepared as disciples of the Lord to pass on the faith. The world is desperately in need of the joy of the Gospel.

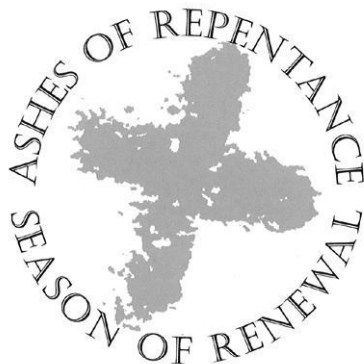
**LENT BEGINS ON FEB. 18<sup>TH</sup>  
A SEASON TO MAKE PROGRESS  
IN OUR JOURNEY OF FAITH**

A few weeks ago we conducted the first of the rites by which adult inquirers into the Catholic faith begin the journey that leads them to the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation during Holy Week. During this rite of *Acceptance & Welcome* the members of the worshipping assembly consented to accompany these catechumens and candidates with our prayers and to help them by the example of our own practice of the faith. **In truth, we are all on a Journey of Faith that leads to fullness of Life in the kingdom of God.**

On **Ash Wednesday (Feb. 18<sup>th</sup>)** Catholics around the world will crowd into church buildings like ours to be marked with ashes as a sign that during Lent we will become more deliberate in our efforts to **repent and believe the Good News.**

Next week we will send out some materials to help all of us to practice better **Stewardship of our Time to Grow Spiritually** beginning during Lent/Easter and continuing thereafter. As we make this commitment we will be better able to accompany our catechumens & candidates while preparing to renew the promises of our own baptism on Easter.

When we come to Church on Ash Wednesday the wooden cross that we venerate on Good Friday will stand near the baptismal font. On it will be purple slips of paper, each bearing the name of a catechumen or candidate for one or more of the Easter Sacraments. Please take one or more of these and pray for these individuals throughout the season of Lent. On the floor beneath the cross will be a basket in which we ask that you place a copy of your commitment to set aside time for spiritual growth. Later these will be shredded and used as kindling for the New Fire that is blessed at the Easter Vigil.
